

Quizzing with Color-Coded Verses

There are many ways to use the color-coded verse sheets to ask questions to a quizzier. Note that this is an easy way for parents to quiz their child, and adds variety to the quizzier's study time. It will also improve quizzier skills!

Here are some sample ways to make questions.

Names of Individuals:

According to Romans 1:6, what man is mentioned (named)?

(2 part) Romans 1:1 names how many men (people) and who are they?

As found in Romans 1:1, who is called to be an apostle?

Groups of People:

Romans 1:17 mentions what group of people?

(2 part) In Romans 1:14, how many groups of people are mentioned and what are they?

Titles & Classifications:

According to Romans 1:23, how is God described?

Family Members:

According to Romans 1:3, what family member is mentioned?

Geographical Locations:

As found in Romans 1:7, what place is named?

According to Romans 1:15, I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are where?

Body Parts:

(2 part) Romans 3:13 names how many parts of the body and what are they?

As found in Romans 1:21, what body part is mentioned?

Questions and Quotes:

According to Romans 2:3, what question is asked?

As found in Romans 1:17, what is written?

Unique Words:

Locate the verse of study that mentions the word "apostleship".

(Quotation) Quote the verse of study that mentions the word "debtor".

Locate the verse of study that ends with the phrase "throughout the whole world".

Locate the verse of study that mentions the phrase "invisible things".

Note that numbers, colors, furniture, animals, and other charting can be used in questions similar to the ways demonstrated above.
