

Words to use to finish an interrupted question:

who (whom)                      what                      when                      where                      why (for what reason)

with what result    what will happen                      how                      do (doing, did) what  
how is \_\_\_\_\_ addressed (referred to)                      how many \_\_\_\_\_ and what are they  
what kind of \_\_\_\_\_ \*think of something described\*

10 Point Questions: The answers are usually short...1 to 3 words or so.

20 Point Questions: The answers are usually longer...3 to many words.

Try to interrupt after you hear the reference and the question word, followed by one more key word.

These are NOT key words: is was were did the a that

Key words ARE: nouns, pronouns, and verbs

Words that end in "ly" (such as greatly, happily, joyfully) are often answers to the question "how?". These are usually 10 point questions.

On two part questions, interrupt after the first question word. Then try to find a "matching" 2<sup>nd</sup> part to the question, or a logical finish to the question.

Use do/did/doing what to finish a 20 or 30 point question rather than giving a verb.

If the rest of a verse has a phrase that starts with "for (because, to, thus, therefore, that, lest)", then the interruption should be finished with "why?".

Ex: Acc to 3:19, men loved darkness rather than light, why?      because their deeds were evil

10 point quotation questions usually have up to 15 words.

20 point quotation questions usually have 16 to 25 words.

30 point quotation questions are long verses.
